Twenty-four Alachua County Public Schools expanding free meals to all students

Alachua County Public Schools' Food & Nutrition Services (FNS) will be implementing a new program that will provide free breakfasts and lunches for all students at 24 local schools regardless of family income. Families of the students at those schools will not need to submit free and reduced-price meal applications to receive the meals.

The program is part of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) initiative funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Schools were selected based on the percentage of students at the school who are participating in one or more of a variety of public assistance/service programs, such as Head Start, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.
