Englewood Schools Nutrition Services Civil Rights Complaint Procedure



How to File a Complaint

- Civil rights complaints can be directed to the Director of Nutrition Services.
- Complaints can be made verbally (in person or over the phone) or in writing by submitting the Nutrition Services Civil Rights Complaint Form. Complaints may also be filed anonymously.
- Completion of the Civil Rights Complaint Form is not a prerequisite for filing a complaint.

Information Collected Regarding a Complaint

When filing a complaint, the following information will be requested:

- Name, address, and telephone number of the complainant unless the complainant requests to remain anonymous.
- The nature of the incident or action that led the complainant to feel discrimination was a factor.
- The basis on which the complainant believes discrimination exists.
- The names, telephone numbers, titles, and business or personal addresses of persons who may have knowledge of the alleged discriminatory action.
- The date(s) during which the alleged discriminatory action occurred.

Forwarding a Complaint

Once made, complaints are forwarded to

- CDE Office of School Nutrition
- USDA Mountain Plains Regional Office
- USDA Office of Civil Rights
- FNS Office of Civil Rights
