Make sure you fill out a Family Lunch Application as soon as possible as it will determine your child's eligibility for free or reduced price meals. ten, you must fill out a new application even if other children already have an approved application. New students will not automatically be covered!



Student Allergy/Medical Statement Online

If your child has a documented medical condition or food allergy that requires modifications in his or her diet, please fill out a Medical Statement to Request Special Meals and/or Ac-

commodations. This allows us to provide your child with meals they can safely enjoy. The form is available under the "forms" area of the Nutrition Service website. http:// foodservice.lodiusd.net A physician must fill out and sign the request for special meals and/or accommodations form and return to the school.

Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

Fourteen qualifying schools will implement CEP beginning the first day of the 2018-19 school year. CEP is a meal provision program required by SB 138 and the Healthy Hungry-Free Kids Act that allows meals to be served at no charge to all students without having to fill out a school meal application. Parents/Guardians of students enrolled at these schools will be notified in first day packets. Please visit our website for more information!

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

For the 2018-19 school year, ten elementary school sites have been awarded a Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) Federal Grant. At FFVP schools, students receive 3-5 extra servings of fresh fruits and vegetables each week in addition to the produce served during breakfast, lunch, snack, and supper programs.
