The State of Tennessee is awarding federal funds from the USDA for the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) (CFDA # 10.582). Funds are to be used to purchase, prepare, and distribute fresh fruits and vegetables <u>at no charge to the students in the school</u>. The program should be structured so that maximum benefits go to the children. Each selected site has the option to spend up to 10 percent of the total allotment for allowable administrative costs.

We are pleased to announce that the schools listed below have been selected to receive up to the total amount noted for the 2018-19 school year to operate the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program. These schools will have 18 percent of the total amount available to spend between July 1 and Sept. 30, 2018. Funds remaining from that 18 percent after Sept. 30 will be lost; they will not roll over to Oct. 1. The remaining 82 percent of your funds must be spent between Oct. 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019. All participating School Food Authorities (SFAs) will be contacted to take part in a mandatory webinar start-up training. All books and records relating to the award shall be made available as required by the state and federal regulations, for inspection and audit by state and federal auditors. If for some reason you are unable to participate in this program or no longer want to participate, please let us know as soon as possible so we can reallocate the funds. This will not affect your ability to reapply next year.
