Lunch Meals will be served: June 15 –July 23, 2015 (No lunch served on July 3) Monday – Friday 11:45 AM - 12:30 PM

A **FREE** midmorning snack will also be provided.

Who is Eligible?

All children 18 years of age and under are eligible to receive FREE meals. Additionally, 19 year-olds and older who have a mental or physical disability (as determined by a State or local educational agency) and who participate during the school year in a public or private nonprofit school program (established for the mentally or physically disabled) are also eligible to receive **FREE** meals. No need to sign up or apply for the program—just bring yourself and enjoy tasty and nutritious meals.
