The Law

To help combat childhood obesity and improve children health, the Child Nutrition and WIC Reauthorization Act of 2004 (PL # 108-265) requires each local educational agency that receives funding for U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Child Nutrition Program to establish a local school wellness policy.

With this new requirement, the U.S. Congress recognizes that schools play a critical role in creating a healthy environment for the preventions of childhood obesity and for combating problems, like Type 2 Diabetes, that are associated with poor nutrition and physical inactivity.

To help combat childhood obesity the Tunica County School Board adopts this Wellness Policy with the following commitments to implementing a coordinated approach to school health. This policy is designed to effectively utilize schools and community resources and to equitably serve the needs and interest of all students and staff at Rosa Fort High School, taking into consideration differences in culture.

Rosa Fort High School Wellness Policy

Rationale:

The link between health of students and learning is well documented. If children are to be successful in school they cannot be tired, hungry, sick, suffering from drugs abuse, or worried that school is an unsafe environment in which they could become a victim of a violent act. It has become apparent that problems such as poor nutrition, lack of physical activity, substance abuse, depression, teen pregnancy, obesity, bullying, and more can adversely affect not only a child's health, but also his or her ability to learn! And that is precisely why a coordinated approach to school health can make a difference! A coordinated approach to school health improves kid's health and their capacity to learn through the support of families, schools, and communities working together. At its very core, a coordinated approach to school health is about keeping students healthy over time, reinforcing positive healthy behaviors throughout the school day, and making it clear that good health and learning go hand and hand.

Goals:

All students at Rosa Fort High School shall possess the knowledge and skills necessary to make healthy choices that promote healthy lifestyles. All staff at Rosa Fort High School is encouraged to model healthful eating and physical activity as a valuable part of daily life.
