Consent Form and Sign Up Form for eLearning Meal Distribution

The USDA requires parent/guardian consent for reimbursable meals to be distributed to eLearning students under the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) for the 2020-2021 School Year. Please complete this form and email to dalleva@lcscmail.com or mail to Lake Central Food Service, Grimmer Middle School, 225 W 77th Ave, Schererville, IN 46375. By signing this form you consent to the following requirements:

1. This form needs to be completed to pick up meals.
2. Distribution will be on Tuesdays at Grimmer Middle School Door J. Hours for pick up are 11:00-1:00. You will receive 5 breakfast and 5 lunch meals.
3. School break/holiday days will not be included in meal distribution. Please see the eLearning menu online.
4. Any changes to the program will be posted on the Food Service main page.
5. Meals may be picked up by the parent, guardian, or student or another designated adult as instructed by the parent or guardian.
6. Proof of identity will be required if asked by a Food Service employee.
7. **The service is for Lake Central School Corporation, St. Mike, and St. John eLearning students only.**
8. All meals are currently free through the end of the 2020-2021 school year or until funds are depleted, whichever comes first. When this program concludes all meals will be charged to the student's food service account based on current eligibility. (free, reduced, or paid) Families will be notified when the funding ends and may decide at that time to terminate meal pick up.
9. Please complete a Free and Reduced meal application online on the LCSC website at any time to see if your family may qualify for meal/textbook assistance.
10. Rosters verifying student names will be used and checked off to distribute meals and to verify identity.
11. We can only provide one breakfast and one lunch per student per day.
12. Meals will be made weekly for all students listed on this form. Please let the food service office know immediately to stop meal pick up. Please call 219-865-4416 X 4.
13. For any special diet concerns please contact Food Service.
14. Locations and times for pick up are subject to change at any time.
15. If LCSC is closed on a Tuesday for inclement weather (snow/cold), there will be no meal distribution.
