Blue Creek School: Breakfast 7:45am – 10:00 am; Lunch 11:00 am– 12:30 pm

Colonie Youth Center: Breakfast 8:45am – 9:15am; Lunch 11:45am – 12:15 pm

Goodrich Building: Breakfast 8:30 am – 9:00 am; Lunch 11:30 am – 12:00 pm

Shaker Junior High School: Breakfast 8:30 am – 9:30 am; Lunch 11:00 am – 1:00 pm

St. Kateri Parish School: Breakfast 8:00 am – 8:45 am; Lunch 11:00 am – 12:00 pm
