The 311 county hotline is taking calls from home bound individuals who may not be able to go to the many Food Distribution centers/pantries. The county will assess individuals for home delivery (in Huntington only) and refer them to the Town of Huntington and FSL to arrange for the delivery of food. Food will be delivered by volunteers, coordinated by Family Service League. Boxes of food (each containing 3 day supply/person – 3 meals each day for family of four) will be distributed.

- Eligibility:
 - Veterans may come once a week
 - All others may come once a month
 - All clients will be given list of food resources close to their residence for interim needs
- Procedure:
 - Clients should come to front door to sign in.
 - If they are new clients, they must give their name, address and number of people in family. This is required by the agency.
 - If there are food allergies, please let staff know. Food requests will be taken into consideration based on availability.
